

Children's Classes

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY: Children of every age are encouraged to participate in the service as well as their age-related classes. Our classes follow the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd curriculum. Further information is available on our church website ctrnorthshore.org.

Nursery Atrium: Care is provided for children ages 0-3 throughout the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. services.

9:00 AM — During the sermon, children of all ages are invited to gather in the Baptistry for a time of prayer, scripture, and song.

10:00 AM — Children's Formation Hour: Children ages 3-5 and 9-12 meet in the Sheepfold, our temporary modular classroom. Children ages 6-8 meet on the Parish Hall stage.

11:00 AM — At the singing of the Gloria, children depart for Catechesis in procession, following the Cross. Children ages 3-5 go left to the Sheepfold; children ages 6+ go right to the Parish Hall. They return during the Offertory for Holy Communion.

During all services, the Retreat Room (in the back of the church) is provided for you to use with a restless child. From there you can see and hear the service.
